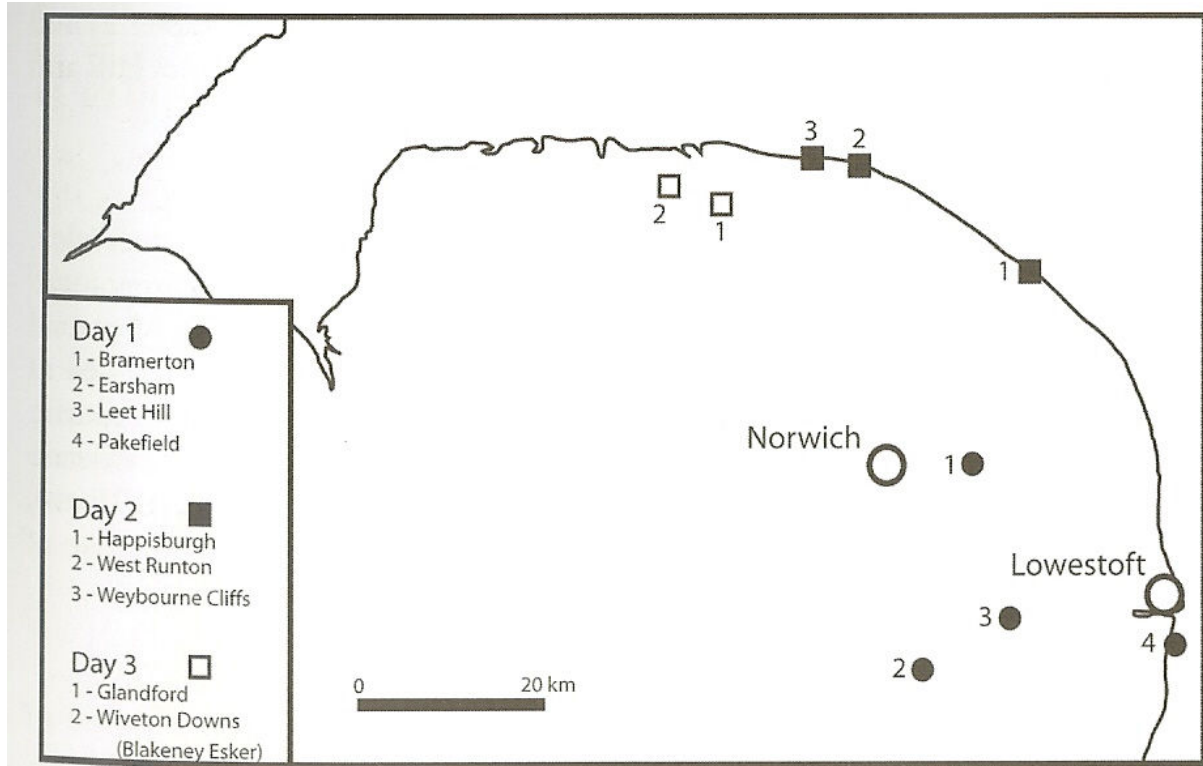


Figure 1. Location of the sites to be visited during the course of the September 2007 short field meeting.
